As I pen this, it is mid-March and all of us are wondering where Spring is, the UP with -9 F temps. and -20 F wind chills, and Southern Michigan digging out from what they hope is their last winter storm. In spite of Mother Nature, our 2014 spring event season is up and going. I am hearing mixed reports with some chapters experiencing declining attendance and others with good attendance & positive numbers. Remember that the personal touch is still the best way to sell event tickets and "fill the hall".

On January 31st and February 1st, we held our annual Leadership Conference in the Higgins Lake, DNR RAM Center. Despite the adverse weather, we had more than 75 volunteers and staff in attendance. Among the topics covered were the event invitation and mailing program, the new event management system from DU NHQ, the electronic Blue Sheet, Calendar Raffles 2014 and 2015, and selection of our next State Chair-Elect.

Our 2014 calendar raffle netted us just over \$100,000.00 and was a virtual sell-out with very few glitches to mar the success. At this point we are almost ¼ of the way through the drawings for 2014 and have had no problems. As a result of the success of the current raffle, we have increased the number of calendars for 2015, to 5000 and the number of guns to five per week. At each of these events, a lucky volunteer also won a Mossberg 535 Waterfowl shotgun donated by the state organization, in appreciation, for our volunteers.

MI DU supports DNR's PURE MICHIGAN HUNT



Three lucky hunters won a new Mossberg shotgun thanks to Michigan Ducks Unlimited, in the Pure Michigan Hunt drawing.

The latest winners - Bill Kring of Cadillac, Bruce Shaneour of Osseo and Frank Zrepskey of Algonac - will have a pocket full of hunting licenses and over \$4,000 worth of hunting gear.

"I had a voicemail to call Russ Mason," said Shaneour, who works in sales at Signature Ranch Collection. He returned that call to hear the DNR Wildlife Division chief explain that he is one of the lucky Pure Michigan Hunt winners. "I didn't tell many people until I got the paperwork in the mail," Shaneour added.

Zrepskey, now retired from the City of Detroit, said he was "one happy camper." A member of the St. Clair Flats Waterfowlers, Zrepskey said he couldn't believe he is a winner.

When Kring, the general manager at 9&10 News in Cadillac, got the phone call from Mason, he said, "All I could think is - are you kidding me?" Kring explained that he had heard about the Pure Michigan Hunt from a past winner in the area and thought he would buy five applications because it goes to a good cause.

Proposals, proposals, proposals! As Ducks Unlimited conservation staff, we are relentless in our pursuit of local, state, federal, and foundation, funding opportunities that help maximize the DU dollars you raise for the ducks. The first quarter of the year is what I call "proposal season", especially considering the millions of dollars that become available this time of year via the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative.

Here are a few of the things keeping Jason busy

Worked with Michigan Department of Natural Resources staff to develop and submit two proposals to secure funding needed to implement the St. John's Marsh - Phase I project. DU submitted a \$1,088,534 pre-proposal funding request in mid-February to the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation - Sustain Our Great Lakes program.

Attended the Michigan Conservation Coalition meeting at the Michigan United Conservation Clubs office in East Lansing to discuss items including, the Asian carp U.S. Army Corps Report, Scientific Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act, Michigan DNR budget priorities, update on Belle Isle Park, MI DNR habitat conservation grant opportunities, and other items.

Prepared for the Healing Our Waters Coalition - Great Lakes Day visits with multiple reps and senators on Capitol Hill. More to come next month...

Attended a multi-partner Great Lakes Phragmites Collaborative Steering Committee meeting.

Worked with DU engineering staff on permit modification needs for the Erie Marsh Preserve Phase I & Phase II project design (Monroe Co.).

Worked with several of DU's Saginaw Bay to Lake Erie Coastal Habitat Initiative - Phase III North American Wetlands Conservation Act partners to further multiple acquisition, restoration and enhancement projects in the Lake Erie Watershed.

Attended Billie Ray Fann's Volunteer Appreciation event in St. Clair Shores at Barrister Gardens.

Just a reminder that the Michigan Ducks Unlimited license plate will be available in June 2014! Proceeds will go to wetlands conservation here in Michigan!

Dane Cramer, Regional Biologist - Michigan

There's grant writing season in the winter, and construction season in the summer, and of course, duck season in the fall (although despite my best attempts no one pays me to duck hunt). Cabin fever hits me here at the office the same way it does at home. And in the same way that we are all making plans to get out to the garage to do some spring cleaning. I'm making plans to get out and find some new wetland projects. In the last half of March and first half of April, I'll be out of the office more than I'll be in. Not only is it going to feel good to get out to watch the world shed its winter blanket, it's going to be nice to stretch the legs and get some fresh air, too.

Here are some of the things keeping Dane busy

Wrote and submitted the fourth annual report for the Southeast Lake Michigan Coastal Habitat Project North American Wetlands Conservation Act grant (Lake Michigan region).

Continued to work on developing a \$1 million North American Wetlands Conservation Act proposal to support a second phase of the Southeast Lake Michigan Coastal Habitat Project to conserve of wetlands and wetland-associated wildlife throughout a 28-county project area in western and southwestern Michigan.

Modified our existing agreement with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources to allow us to invoice contractor costs for the nearly completed Maple River B pump (Grafton County).

Generated the annual funding report to the Saginaw Bay Watershed Initiative Network for their support of the "Michigan Waterfowl Legacy - Implementation in the Saginaw Bay" project.

Wrote and submitted the third annual report for our National Fish & Wildlife Foundation Sustain Our Great Lakes grant to restore wetlands and fish passage in the Shiawassee Flats

Wrote a Sustain Our Great Lakes pre-proposal, for a second phase of the Restoring Wetlands and Fish Passage in the Shiawassee Flats project to continue our work reconnecting floodplain forested wetlands to the river system at Shiawassee National Wildlife Refuge.

Completed National Environmental Protection Act and Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act clearances for the 940-acre "Restoring Wetlands and Fish Passage in the Shiawassee Flats" project. National Historic Preservation Act clearance is currently under review.

Recipe of the Quarter

Wild Turkey Breast with Peach & Pecan Chutney

Compliments of Dave Steinbach

Ingredients:

2 wild turkey breasts, skin removed
1 cup dry sherry
1/4 cup soy sauce
1/2 cup orange juice
1/3 cup peanut or soy oil
4 garlic cloves, minced
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
6 cups warm cooked rice



Chutney

6 medium firm peaches; peeled, and coarsely diced.
1 tsp. salt
1 -2 jalapeno peppers, seeded and finely minced
3/4 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup white vinegar
2 tsp. fresh ginger, minced
1/2 cup roasted pecans, chopped

Instructions:

Combine sherry with next 5 ingredients.
Add to turkey in a plastic, ceramic or glass bowl.
Cover and refrigerate for 2 to 4 hours.

Prepare chutney:

Combine all ingredients & simmer until peaches are soft.

Remove turkey from marinade and discard marinade.
Grill breasts, but do not cook beyond 150 degrees.
Allow the cooked breasts to rest for 5 minutes before slicing.
To serve, mound some rice on each plate.
Slice turkey and arrange slices over rice.
Spoon the chutney over the turkey slices.



Tips to help your committee grow!

The following are ideas and suggestions for your committee to discuss when planning ways to increase the size and strength of your committee:

Committees need to discuss and recognize that the key for growth and sustained success lies in committee expansion.

Remember, a committee person is anyone who makes a single positive contribution to your event, regardless of whether they attend a single committee meeting. Keep all committee members informed and active.

Ask people to sell event tickets. Adding event ticket sellers to your committee is the best way to increase your events success.

Add diversity to your committee by recruiting people from professions, neighborhoods, age groups, etc, which are not currently represented on your committee.

Double your committee size by applying the “Each One Recruit One” approach every year. Bigger is Better regardless of existing committee size.

Recruit for specific chapter positions: Recruit a local accountant to be your treasurer or recruit a “PR” person for your chapter’s publicity chair position.

Be organized – organize and assign specific tasks to specific committee members.

Recruit people who have interest in DU’s mission and who also have a strong connection in the community, i.e. doctors, lawyers, business owners, etc. The busy guy who’s into everything. Sometimes these busy guys are good bets.

Recruit constantly. Recruiting is a constant job. All committees need to make this a # 1 priority. The committees that are top performers need to recruit to maintain this level. Weaker committees can only improve through recruiting new people.
