Posting Your Events

Having your event posted on the Ducks.org/Michigan website is a great way to make sure your event is "seen".

Here are a few pointers for your web advertisement to help you get the most of this great service:

1 – Remember the basics. Put the important information (Who, What, When, and Where) right up at the top of your ad where is can be found easily.

2 – Make it fun! Describe the event and the activities. Do your best to make people want to come to your event.

3 – Avoid long letters. Keep your web ad to the design of a flyer. Writing a letter to your sponsors and past attendees is fine for a mailing, but not for the web.

4 – Put up your flyer! I can put your event flyer on the web for you. Send me your flyer in picture format (jpeg or png), or as a pdf. <u>The width is limited to 500 pixels</u> however, so you may have to modify your flyer. If you send me the flyer in a Microsoft Word format, then I can easily modify it for you.

5 – No flyer? No Problem! I can make one for you. Please send me the event information in Microsoft Word format and I'll put your web ad together for you.

6 - Sell your event tickets online! DU will handle the transactions for you. The first person listed as your contact on the web ad will receive an email for each transaction, so you always know your seating availability.

7 – I'll post your pictures! Send me up to six pictures of the highlights of your event and I'll post them in the Michigan DU Photo Gallery.

A few things more...

I need the primary contact person's name, email address, and phone number for each event. Be sure to give me the full address of the event location, for the map/directions feature. Please be clear what a buyer receives in a package deal.

Let me know if the annual DU membership is included with <u>each</u> ticket sold. Send me any pictures in jpeg or png format.

Recipe of the Quarter

CORNED GOOSE

Ingredients:

4 -6 Goose Breasts

1 cup Morton's Tender Quick

1/2 cup sugar*

¹/₂ cup pickling spice

1 head garlic cloves (minced) about ¼ cup of minced from a jar.

1/4 cup of apple cider vinegar

Directions:

In a non-metallic container that seals tight, mix brine and meat with enough water to cover meat.

Refrigerate for 7 days.

Shake at least once a day.

*Note 1 (I have used a mix of both white and brown sugar)

After 7 days, rinse meat to remove loose spices.

Put 4 tablespoons of pickling spice in two Bouquet Garni (Cheesecloth bags).

Put both the meat and the cloth bag into a pot of water with just a splash of apple cider vine-gar.

Boil/Simmer for about 3 hours.

*Note—You will need to add water while simmering.

Allow meat to cool before slicing.

From the Great Lakes to downtown Lansing; Waterfowl Need Political Support

Nearly 50% of Ducks Unlimited's annual budget is public money derived from federal and state grants. These financial resources have enabled the organization to deliver 13.3 million acres of conservation work nationwide since 1937, over 65,000 of which have occurred right here in Michigan, giving Michiganders world-class waterfowling opportunities and the quality habitat needed to sustain healthy duck and geese populations year after year. The sobering reality of these important monetary sources is that they are all creatures of statute and could be eliminated tomorrow if legislative support for them weakens.

Federal programs like the Farm Bill, North American Wetlands Conservation Act, and Great Lakes Restoration Initiative all require congressional approval to remain intact. State programs like waterfowl habitat stamps, DU state license plates, and dedicated funding mechanisms like conservation sales taxes are also sources that DU relies on for significant levels of funding, and are often subject to the ebb and flow of political will.

Given this, building tight-knit relationships with our lawmakers in Michigan is imperative to accomplishing our organizational goals and advancing our mission. Thanks to the efforts of DU's committed volunteers and engaged membership, working in tandem with DU policy staff, the organization enjoys a strong relationship with the Michigan Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus, a bipartisan bicameral group of elected officials committed to advancing sportsmen's interests in the state. With over 80 members, this group of lawmakers is a powerful force standing ready to protect and advance the rights of hunters, anglers, and trappers in Michigan and to drive a conservation agenda critical to protecting wildlife habitat and safeguarding science-based management of our natural resources.

The Caucus is led by four Co-Chairs, Sen. Mike Green (R-Mayville), Sen. David Knezek (D-Dearborn Heights), Rep. Andrea LaFontaine (R-Columbus Twp.), and Rep. John Kivela (D-Marquette). DU has been extremely supportive and engaged with the Caucus over the last several years, regularly attending and sponsoring events, as well as serving on the Michigan Sportsmen's Caucus Advisory Council, which helps provide additional guidance and resources to our pro-sportsmen legislators.

"The opportunity to work with the Sportsmen's Caucus gives Ducks Unlimited a wonderful chance to interact with those legislators that have our interests in mind. By developing relationships with the men and women that make the state's decisions, when issues come up that can affect our mission, we have a ready-made contact with those that can move our issues forward," said MI DU State Policy Chair Steve Wyckoff. "In addition to the interaction with the legislature, the Sportsmen's Caucus also provides another opportunity to work with the Department of Natural Resources and other NGO's."

It is critically important for MI DU members to engage their elected officials and share their passion for the outdoors with them. Next time you speak with your Senator or Representative, ask them if they're members of the Michigan Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus. If they're not, encourage them to join and help protect Michigan's outdoor heritage and the incredible natural resources upon which this heritage depends. Also, invite them to your DU event and ask them to join DU!

Order Your Ducks Unlimited Fundraising License Plate Today!

To replace a valid license plate with a Ducks Unlimited plate, or to purchase a collector version, fill out this application. When you purchase a Ducks Unlimited plate, \$25 of the \$35 purchase fee is given to the special cause. For an additional prorated fee, your plate may be personalized. Check for the availability of a personalized plate using <u>Plate it Your Way</u>. Personalized plates may only be ordered at a Secretary of State office. Your new plate will arrive by mail within 21 days. Note: A \$10 fee is added to your vehicle registration fee when renewing a fundraising plate. The university or special cause receives the \$10.

To Purchase by MAIL:

Complete the order form below. If paying by check or money order, make payable to **State of Michigan**. If paying by Discover, MasterCard or Visa credit card, complete the credit card section below. Mail the completed application along with payment to: **Michigan Department of State, Renewal By Mail Unit, Lansing, MI 48918.**

To Purchase by FAX:

If purchasing by fax, you must pay by credit card. Fax the completed application to: 517-322-6822, 24 hours a day/7 days a week.



Ducks Unlimited Collector Plates

When you purchase a collector plate for \$35, the special cause or university receives \$25. Collector plates are for **display purposes only** — **not for vehicle registration**. Each collector plate includes the word "SAMPL," the special cause or university logo and name. Collector plates cannot be personalized.
